Register of Protected Areas under WFD


Protected areas are those ones that have been designated under EU legislation to protect:

- Surface water
- Groundwater
- Habitats and Species that directly depend on the water
- SNC SR has developed a list of habitats that directly depend on the water.
- The list consists of the current database of wetlands, NATURA 2000 sites regarded to water, small-scaled aquatic protected areas.

Establishment of type – specific reference conditions under WFD

- According to WFD it is necessary to identify what the relevant aspects of a water body's characteristics would be like if there were no alternations to the body resulting from human activities.
- SNC SR developed a GIS layer of proposed sites with reference conditions.
- WRI used this document for the elaboration of final reference conditions.

Monitoring of ecological and chemical status for surface water:

- Surveillance monitoring
- Operational monitoring
- · Investigative monitoring



NATURA 2000

Monitoring of species and biotopes of European importance status.

- SNC SR has prepared the proposal of protected areas monitoring.
- SNC SR cooperated with WRI in methodology of surface water and groundwater monitoring development.
- SNC SR has developed the methodology for the monitoring of fish and other aquatic animal species and biotopes.
- SNC SR has proposed monitoring sites network.

The Programme of measures

- The Programme of measures to be established by the end of 2009 will consist of basic measures to be implemented in order to achieve the objectives defined for 2015.
- SNC SR provided WRI by the List of Pressures and Impacts which is a part of the Standard Data Form for each NATURE 2000 aquatic site.

The List of Pressures and Impacts consists of:


- Proposed management measures
- Activities which may have negative impact on the conservation objectives in the protected areas.
- Activities which may have negative impact on the conservation objectives outside the protected areas.

Identification of main water management problems concerning surface water

- SNC SR in co-operation with Slovak Water Management Company has started the identification of barriers for fish migration on the rivers.
- WRI will use this document for the development of necessary measures for bodies of surface water restoration.
- SNC SR will prepare National Programme of Wetland and River systems Revitalization.

Development of the Management Plans

WFD

- River Basin Management Plan is a strategic planning document and an operational guide to implement programmes of measures.
- In 2006, WRI published the schedule and working programme for River Basin Management Plans development.

NATURA 2000

- SNC SR is preparing the methodology for Integrated Management Plan for NATURA 2000 sites, large and small – scaled protected areas and for Ramsar sites.
- In 2007, SNC SR will start to develop the management plans for above mentioned protected areas.
