OBJECTIVE - PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

To ensure public participation and involvement of key stakeholders in environmental planning and decision making in the Danube

- » Early 90ties, capacities of and NGO involvement low,
- » 1992-96: EPDRB Institutional development GEF initiated platform for NGOs,
- » 1997-99: DPRP further focus trough grants and DEF support,
- » 2001-6: DRP Substantial support (US\$ 5,3 mill) for NGOs, Grants, Communication and PP.





DRP - PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PROJECTS

- » NGO support DEF –establish strong network and rising capacities and;
- » Small Grants Programme practical activities related to pollution issues;
- » Communication and awareness raising, dissemination of information and building capacities of key partners and stakeholders;
- » Access to information public participation pilot projects.

OBJECTIVE DEF SUPPORT

- » To raise the capacities and awareness on water pollution issues of NGOs in the Region;
- » To establish strong plat-form for NGO participation and network for communication and cooperation between stakeholders;
- » To develop channels of communication to Danube population.





PROJECT ACTIVITIES - DEF SUPPORT

- » Provided support for operation of the DEF Secretariat, facilitate communication and information management at local, regional and international level;
- » Organised consultation meetings and training workshops on nutrient issues, WFD, communication skills etc.;
- » Supported communication tool as publications, Danube Day, Danube art master, campaigning on pollution issues etc.

 - » ICPDR, Danube Day, etc.






SMALL GRANTS - OBJECTIVE


- » Enable NGOs to implement local scale technical pollution reduction projects, model activities / innovative practices;

- » To raise the profile and the awareness of the UNDP/GEF Project, ICPDR and Danube issues (nutrient reduction);
- » To develop and dissemination information.





COMMUNICATION - ACTIVITIES

Process - communication as a tool

- » Working with key partners and sub-project managers on best way of communicating the issues;
- » Specified Terms of References with focus on communication - to improve understanding of project objectives - improve outreach and result;
- » Sub-communication strategies on how and what to disseminate to whom;
- » Raise the profile (branding) of DRP and ICPDR;
- » Communication training.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION / PP PROJECT OBJECTIVE

- » To increase public access to environmental information and promote the participation of citizens and NGOs in protecting the Danube River and its tributaries;
- » Special emphasis on supporting public involvement in the RBM planning process – WFD and Aarhus Convention;
- » REC RFF and NYU.





PROJECT ACTIVITIES

- » Worked together with public officials and NGOs at national, regional and local levels in 5 countries: Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Romania and Serbia and Montenegro;
- » National level: identified the main barriers to public access to information and involvement – tools and strategies developed adapted to national needs;
- » 5 Demonstration projects testing of approaches -hotspots – DEF;
- Regional level: lessons learned and shared experience
 study tours, trainings and regional meetings.

- » Experience and lessons learned has been disseminated throughout the Danube.






PROJECT RESULTS AND WAY FORWARD
